A user friendly Software has been developed to monitor, implement and support NGC activities at district as well as school level. Schools can submit their utilization certificates and annual reports online instead of physical copies. NGC team, district nodal officers and district assistants can monitor and support NGC activities online.

Awareness Activities at Coastal beaches

Cleanliness drives on coastal beaches

FMPRI organized mass cleanliness-cumawareness drive in association with Society of Integrated Coastal Management (SICOM) of MOEFCC under "Swachh Nirmal Tat Abhiyan" programme for 7 days in 6 beaches of Karnataka. Cleanliness drives were organized in Bengre beach, (Mangalore district), Hejamadi beach, (Udupi dist), Ravindranath Tagore, Gokarna, Apsarakonda, Nirvana beaches (Uttara kannada district) from 11-11-2019 to 18-11-2019. Beach cleaning activities were conducted in association with education department, district authorities, NGOs, volunteers, local villagers, panchayats, Government, private and semi government organisations, school & college students. Eco club students and teachers actively participated in the drive. The programme received wide publicity and was covered in TV and print media. Waste collected under cleanliness drive were disposed as per waste management rules by the local authorities. Cleanliness drive was a huge success as this made our beaches clean and created awareness amongst citizens about the importance of coastal ecosystems. Over 10,000+ people were part of the programme.

To plan sustainable tourism and healthy coastal management, MoEF&CC conceived an integrated coastal management scheme viz. BEAMS (Beach Management Services) to reduce existing pollutants on beaches and to aspire & achieve such high International Standards in India. To achieve this goal, EMPRI organised Environment Education Events at Padubidri and Kasarkod beaches on 10th and 20th February 2020 respectively. Environment Education Events were conducted to create awareness on environmental management including cleanliness and solid waste management in beaches. As part of the events, walkathons were organized. Eco club school children participated in walkothon and raised slogans to save the beaches. Drawing and painting competitions on theme "Save our Beach" and Eco quiz competitions were organized for school children. Officials from tourism department, forest department along with education department, volunteers, teachers, tourists, local communities, BEAMS services staff and school children took part in the event. Officials and subject experts delivered talks on topics such as marine bio diversity, marine pollution, effects of plastic pollution on marine animals etc. Art Kits, Stationary items and caps were distributed and refreshments were arranged for the participants. Prizes were distributed to the winners, 500+ people participated in the programmes.

Anti-litter campaign and Plastic Ban Awareness training

On 11th October, 2019, EMPRI conducted Anti-litter campaign and plastic ban awareness training to school children at Sacred Heart Girls High School, Residency Road. Bengaluru. EMPRI distributed hand-outs on banned plastic and its alternatives as per Karnataka Government notification notified under Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 to promote reduction on the use of plastics. Banned plastic items notified by Karnataka Government and the eco-friendly alternatives were displayed for students and teachers. NGC team guided the school in implementing the project of segregation and collection of household plastics by school children at school premises and recycling plastic from the approved vendors. 300+ School children, teachers and school association members participated in the programme.

Cleaning of Cauvery River, Srirangapatna, Mandya District

On 26-10-2019, EMPRI conducted cleanliness drive of Cauvery River Front at Rajasopanakatte, Sriranganatha Temple, Srirangapattana, Mandya District in association with Mandya Municipality Corporation, JSS College and local NGOs.

Dr, K H Vinay Kumar, Director of EMPRI inaugurated the cleanliness drive and initiated the plantation drive. Dr K H Vinay Kumar also addressed the general public and highlighted the importance of rivers. Awareness to public was created through road Jatha by holding placards with environmental messages by the participants. Street plays were organized which aimed at generating awareness among people on the critical environmental situation in the world, water conservation, and plastic ban. NGOs, Eco club School children, College students, teachers, EMPRI staff members and public participated in the cleaning activity. Cleanliness drive created awareness of the depleting water body, Cauvery River, a main source of water for many. Solid waste such as Plastic water bottles, plastic wrappers, plastic bags, plastic plates and plastic cups were picked and collected from the Cauvery River Front and Cauvery River Catchment Area. Collected waste of nearly 600 Kilograms was handed over to Srirangapattana City Municipal Council, Government of Karnataka (GoK). Over 1000+ people participated.

Training Programmes conducted under NGC

SATCOM Training to Eco club in-charge teachers

SATCOM (Satellite Communication) teleconference training was conducted to ecoclub in charge teachers on 21st August 2019 at DSERT (Department of State Educational Research & Training). Two separate training sessions, one for existing eco clubs and another for new eco club schools were organized. NGC team organized orientation of NGC programmes and activities to teachers. Information on documents such as utilization certificates, annual reports, schools's bank account proofs were briefed in the training. Professor Nagesh Hegde, renowned Environmental Journalist and writer delivered lectures on various environmental issues. He also discussed the various measures required to save environment, prevent environmental damage and briefed the teachers about eco club activities to be carried out at school level. 3353 participants from 34 Educational districts including officials from education department and teachers had participated in the programme.

NGC-District Nodal officers Workshop



Officers nominated by the office of Deputy Director of Public Instruction & Deputy Project Coordinator, Samagra Shikshana, are working as District Nodal Officers for NGC at respective district of 34 districts of Karnataka State. These nodal officers are the intermediators between state office and district. Nodal officers coordinate with NGC team and schools in implementing eco-club activities.

EMPRI organized one day workshop for district nodal officers in Kumara Krupa Guest House, Bengaluru on 1st October 2019. Dr. K H Vinay kumar, Director EMPRI inaugurated the workshop and briefed about the objectives of NGC to the participants. Mr. Ramesha C, State Nodal Officer-NGC guided the team regarding innovative ideas which can be implemented at school level. NGC team delivered training on NGC programmes and activities and discussed the plan of action for the year 2019-20. Interactive session and discussion were held to implement NGC programme effectively.

Training programmes to district programme assistants

EMPRI had recruited 34 programme assistants to work in 34 educational districts. Primary role of programme assistants is to visit eco club schools as well as to support schools in implementing eco club activities and monitor them. One day training was conducted for the programme assistants at EMPRI office on 30/12/2019. EMPRI team delivered presentation about NGC programme and activities to be implemented at school level. Resource personnel from Azim Premji foundation delivered lecture on initiatives of Azim Premji foundation in creating environmental awareness. Case studies of award winning schools were discussed during the training. Information, Communication & Education materials were distributed to the trainees.

District and Taluk level training programmes for Eco-club incharge teachers

From 3-01-2020 to 29.01.2020, EMPRI in association with Samagra shikshana, Karnataka, Karnataka State Pollution Control Board (KSPCB) and Forest department organized District and Taluk level trainings for eco-club in charge teachers of 34 educational districts. A Total of 68 Trainings were conducted, comprising 34 trainings which were conducted at district headquarters and 34 trainings in taluk of the respective district.
